Ethics Classes in 2018

For those of you who have not heard of Primary Ethics, it is a charity that provides the opportunity for NSW public primary school students who don't attend scripture classes (SRE) to participate in philosophical ethics classes.

This year it has been my privilege to act as both ethics coordinator and as an ethics teacher at Narara Public School. My first year mediating an ethics class has been both challenging and fascinating in equal measure. Within the stage one and stage two classes which have run this year, the children have discussed topics such as,

When is it fair?

Being similar and being different

Good reasons

Being greedy

Is lying wrong

The classes teach children how to approach ethical issues and develop their capacity for considered moral judgement, which will enable them to respond more thoughtfully to many of the problems and issues they will face in their lives. Children learn how to think logically, disagree respectfully and support their arguments with evidence, rather than act according to blind habit or peer pressure.

Both classes are currently oversubscribed .In 2018 I would love to be able to provide classes across all stages and for all families that are interested but to accomplish that we need more teachers. Consequently I would like to hear from anyone interested in volunteering as an ethics teacher next year.

Ethics Teachers receive full training by Primary Ethics, which consists of a two day workshop and short online modules. An age appropriate curriculum and access to teaching resources is provided. Suitable volunteers have an interest in children's education and developing their critical thinking skills and must be available on Thursday morning every second week. From a personal perspective I can recommend it as a fascinating and rewarding way to make a valuable contribution to our school.
