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### **Principal's Message**

#### **End of Year Events**

Recently the Department revised its guidelines. Some of the changes impacting on key end of year activities are as follows:

- Whole school assemblies can recommence for students and staff only.
- Year 6 graduation assemblies and formals can be held with restricted access to visitors based on the physical distancing regulations (4 square metres p/person including all staff, students and visitors).
- End-of-year activities, including award ceremonies, school performances and class party days can proceed for staff and students only as long as they align to the NSW Health and Department of Education guidelines.

We sincerely apologise for this, but we cannot abide by the 4 square metre rule that still stands with current COVID-19 restrictions. 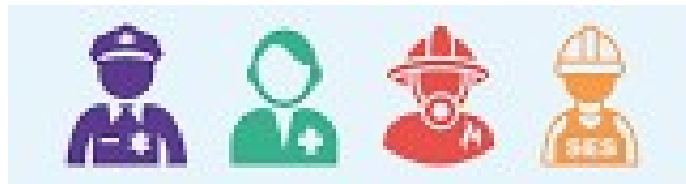

## Primary Ethics classes

### Helping children develop skills for life

Primary Ethics' program gives children the opportunity to discuss ethical issues with their peers while developing important thinking, reasoning and discussion skills. Our innovative curriculum was developed by Dr Sue Knight, a specialist in both philosophy and education. Primary Ethics is a not-for-profit organisation approved to provide ethics education in NSW public schools.

#### Ethics in the infant years

Ethics classes in years k-2 focus on developing core skills such as listening to others, taking turns to speak and giving reasons.

Stories, poems and rhymes prompt children to discuss ethical issues such as hurting someone without meaning to, telling the truth, being kind, forgiving, ownership, fairness and empathy.

Our skills-based topics for this age group include asking and answering questions, disagreeing, changing your mind, working out what is true, giving and evaluating reasons as well as giving examples and counter examples. Logic is also introduced, with topics touching on inductive inference and deductive reasoning.

#### Ethics in the primary years

In years 3-6, ethics students develop their critical thinking and discussion-based skills.

Stories, contemporary issues and real life scenarios form the basis of discussions on ethical issues such as selfishness, how we should treat living things, promises, greed, friendship, cheating, voting, punishment, homelessness, teasing and fairness in society.

Skills-based topics for this age group include respectful disagreement, inferring or figuring things out, validity, generalising, proving claims, structuring arguments, identifying incorrect conclusions, identifying faulty reasoning, evaluating the strength of evidence and thinking about thinking. Primary aged students are encouraged to develop their community of inquiry skills by asking each other well thought out questions and challenging each other's arguments.

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#### Enrolling your child

Ethics classes run weekly during the school year within the Special Religious Education/Special Education in Ethics (SRE/SEE) timetable.

Primary Ethics classes are free of charge.

If you'd like your child to attend ethics classes, advise the school office via a note or email. Your child can start as soon as an ethics teacher is available and a minimum of eight students have enrolled in a class.

#### Getting involved

Ethics classes are taught by specially trained volunteers who are mostly parents or carers. Becoming an ethics coordinator or ethics teacher can be a very rewarding way to be involved in your school community. Volunteer ethics teachers are always needed to ensure that there are adequate classes to meet demand. Experience is not required, comprehensive training and access to lesson materials is provided.

# School Travel for 2021



## 2021 school travel applications are now open

Applications for student travel in 2021 opened from Monday 12 October 2020.

Students who require a School Opal card or travel pass for 2021 can now [apply](#) online. A new application should be submitted if a student is applying for a school travel pass for the first time or requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who have changed school/campus, changed address, repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should [re-apply or update their details](#).

\*Applications must be completed by the student's parent or legal guardian if the student is aged under 16 years. Students 16 years and over must complete the application form themselves.

Where there is a change of distance eligibility based on a student's grade, the system will automatically update a student's entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new [eligibility criteria](#), they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

[Term Bus Pass](#) holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If a student needs to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2020 to ensure that current student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card remains valid. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2020, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2021.

## School travel application endorsements

It is not uncommon for applicants completing the online form to make mistakes, particularly entering their name or date of birth instead of the students. This may be due to an auto-fill function on a device or just human error. We ask that school administrators be cautious of this and do not endorse applications with incorrect information.

If you are aware of or see an obvious error, you can amend the first name, date of birth or grade of a student's travel application by clicking in the relevant row on the portal. Please ensure you have confirmed the information before making any changes. Refer to page 16 of the *School Portal User Guide* for further instructions. The latest version of the user guide is accessible within the School Portal by clicking the arrow next to your username.

If a student's details cannot be confirmed or they are not yet enrolled, please do not endorse the application. By selecting 'no' the application will be rejected and the applicant will be informed. They will then need to submit a new application.

In the event that school administrators endorse an application in error, it would be appreciated if you could advise our SSTS team as soon as possible so the application can be intercepted before an Opal card or travel pass is issued.

If you have staff that have left the school recently and had access to the school portal, please let us know at <https://transportnsw.info/contact-us/feedback/passes-concessions-feedback> and select '*school/operator portal*' and then '*remove existing user access*' so their access can be removed.

## New Concession Entitlement Cards

You can now order the new Transport Concession Entitlement Cards (TCEC) through the Transport for NSW School Portal.

The Transport Concession Entitlement Card will replace the following cards:

- Senior Secondary Student Concession Card (16 years and over) – also used by Mature Secondary Students (18 years and over), Distance Education Students and Home School Students
- Proof of Age card (when a student under 16 years of age looks older)
- Boarder Rail Pass.

It is with great pleasure that we invite your child to attend the Lisarow High School Transition Program, Orientation Day and Information Evening. Year 6 students zoned for Lisarow High School from Lisarow, Ourimbah, Narara, Valley View, Niagara Park, Wyoming Public Schools and other students as appropriate through negotiation with the school are invited to come and experience High School for the day. On the following days:

- Tuesday 17<sup>th</sup> November 2020, Week 6 Term 4 – Transition Day 2
- Tuesday 24<sup>th</sup> November 2020, Week 7 Term 4 - Transition Day 3
- Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> December 2020, Week 8 Term 4 – State wide Orientation Day
- Tuesday 1<sup>st</sup> December 2020, Week 8 Term 4 - Orientation Information Evening 6:00pm

Students are asked to make their own way to and from high school under their parent's care on these days. The school day goes from 8:30am to 2:40pm at Lisarow High School. Parents can collect their children from the bottom bus bay or the top gate from 2:35pm. Staff will wait with all children until their parent arrives.

High School teachers will teach a variety of classes on these days. Students may be involved in English, Mathematics, Science, Human Society and Its Environment, Technology, Music, Dance, Drama, Visual Arts, Mandatory Technology and PDHPE lessons. On Orientation Day, students will be placed in their 2021 classes.

Students are asked to wear their Primary School sports uniform as they will be involved in sporting activities at times during the day. Year 6 students are required to bring their own lunch and recess from home. Due to COVID restrictions students are unable to access the canteen facilities.
