Year 6 Mini Fete



Menstrual Hygiene Program

The NSW Department of Education is introducing a menstrual hygiene program in every NSW public school. As part of the program, schools will receive dispensers that provide free pads and possibly tampons for students to access during school hours.

The menstrual hygiene program aims to reduce any barriers that may prevent students from participating fully in school life. Menstruation (and its unpredictability) may stop students from attending school or taking part in learning activities. There are also known health risks from using improvised sanitary hygiene products. The program has been successfully trialled in 31 schools, with positive feedback received from principals and students alike. It is now time to introduce the program at our school in the coming weeks. A flyer has been included in this newsletter with further information.

School Swimming Scheme

The school swimming scheme starts today, Monday 10th October 2022 for students in Years 2, 3 and 4 and is on each day until Friday 21st October 2022.

Children should wear their swimming costume to school each day under their school uniform. Please bring underwear, a towel, a rash shirt, sunscreen, a hat, a drink bottle with water and warm clothing on a cool day. There will be 3 sessions. The first will leave school at 10.30am and the last returns to school at 2.20pm. Session 1 will be students from 2P and 2/3M. Please do not order lunch orders from the canteen for students in these classes for the duration of swim scheme as they will be leaving the school at the start of lunchtime.



Check-in Assessment for Years 3, 4 and 5

Year 3, 4 and 5 students will participate in a Reading and Numeracy Check-in Assessment during Term 4. The NSW Department of Education Check-in Assessments are available to support schools to assess and monitor student learning. The assessments supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Students with disability will receive the same level of support during the assessments that they would normally receive in the classroom.

A breakdown of the assessment window is as follows:

- Year 3 Week 3 (Tuesday and Wednesday)
- Year 4 Week 1 (Tuesday and Wednesday)
- Year 5 Week 2 (Tuesday and Wednesday)
- Catch-up Assessments Across Week 4

During their assessment week, students will need to bring headphones or earbuds that plug into a computer to enable them to hear audio during the assessment. Earbuds used for mobile phones or other portable devices may be suitable for use during the assessment. The type of computer connection needed is a jack or USB. Please contact the school if you have any trouble sourcing this equipment.

NSW Department of Education - School Infrastructure



The NSW Department of Education is offering menstrual hygiene support for students in every NSW public school from Term 2 2022. The program aims to reduce any barriers that may prevent students from participating fully in school life.

What you need to know:

- The menstrual hygiene program provides clean materials such as pads and tampons to students
- The program aims to reduce health risks for students by offering them clean products at school that can be changed regularly.
- Students with access to clean products can confidently continue their learning activities at school with others.
- From Term 2 2022, every school will offer students access to free hygiene products in the form of pads and/or tampons.
- The hygiene products will be stored in a clean dispenser. Students will be told by their school where they can conveniently and discretely access the dispensers.
- The hygiene products were tested in 31 schools with students and principals reporting a
 positive experience.


