
The department has a service agreement with some providers which have been assessed as meeting privacy and security standards required for the department. The school offers students access to a number of services in addition to these.






Attendance

Attendance is regularly monitored at school, with the firm belief that missed school equals missed learning. Parents are reminded that absences must be notified to the school either with a phone call or with a note to the teacher. Remember, if your child misses one day a week that will equal a term each year, which in turn, is approximately 1.5 years by the end of Year 6 and 2.75 years by the end of Year 12.

If your child is absent from school, you are legally required to explain the reason for their absence within 7 days of the absence. If your doctor provides you with a medical certificate for your child, a copy can be provided to the school to support their absence. Family holidays are not an acceptable category for exemption from school attendance. In most cases these will be documented as an unjustified leave. If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly, you might like to contact the school for assistance.

Students who are displaying flu like symptoms are required to undertake a COVID-19 test and should not return to school until they receive their test results and are symptom free. Information related to household contacts has been supplied previously. If any families are unsure of what to do or where to access the Department's Digital Learning Packs, please don't hesitate to make contact with our school.

Anaphylaxis

Anaphylaxis is a potentially life-threatening medical condition. It is a severe and sudden allergic reaction, which occurs when a person is exposed to an allergen (such as a food product or an insect bite). At Narara Public School we have students that are susceptible to anaphylactic reactions.

In an attempt to keep our students safe and minimise the risk of exposure, we request that all parents clearly label lunch boxes, bottles and other drinks with the name of the child for whom they are intended. We ask that parents remind their children about the importance of washing hands, eating their own food, and not sharing food, food utensils or food containers.

We are also asking parents not to send peanut butter on sandwiches, or nut products in school lunches, but rather save these food preferences for home and for weekends.

School Voluntary Contributions

Each year we ask families to support their child/children by donating a small school contribution per child to the school. This money is used to purchase much needed literacy, numeracy and technology resources. For us to continue to provide additional quality literacy and technology resources, we would appreciate your support.

Voluntary Contributions for 2023 are as follows:

- \$40.00 for the first child
- \$25.00 for the second child
- \$10.00 for the third and each subsequent child

School contributions can be made to your child's class teacher, at the front office or online. A note will be sent home to all families in the coming weeks.

Custody Orders and AVOs

If your child is subject to custody orders, could you please ensure a copy of these orders are lodged with the office staff. Custody orders and the like can often impact on school life in some form or another, so having them on site gives us the best opportunity to support your family. This needs to be done annually to ensure the best care for your child.

Riding Safely to School Declaration

All students riding to school are required to sign the declaration annually. The Riding Safely to School Declaration can be picked up from the front office. Thank you for your support with this initiative. The intention behind the declaration is to keep students safe. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact me via the school.



Procedures for entering and exiting school grounds

Parents are encouraged, where possible, to walk with their child to school to reduce traffic congestion around the school. This also encourages children to be more physically active and provides an opportunity to teach children how to be safe in the traffic environment. It is strongly encouraged that students do not cross the Pacific Highway without adult supervision due to high traffic flow.

There are three entrances to Narara Public School. The front entrance is located on Newling Street leading to a pedestrian crossing, which is supervised by a traffic warden before and after school. Teachers assist with supervision of students at the completion of school (2:30pm) with bus lines and walkers on Newling Street and the side entrance on Douglas Close.

Parents and students are not permitted to walk through the staff car park as this is not a safe pedestrian area. Unless parents / carers have approval from the school or have a clearly displayed disability parking permit they are not to access the school carpark. The school carpark is for staff and students requiring transport. There are also 2 accessible car spaces for people who have a mobility disability. We are finding more and more families are using the carpark in the morning for OSH drop-offs. This should not happen after 7:20am. If you are dropping off your child/ren to OSH in the morning, we ask you use the section at the end of the carpark closest to the front of the administration office. I ask that parents do not park in a spot that has a yellow reserve sign as these are reserved for staff.

Parent / Carer Recommendations:

- Hold your child's hand when crossing a road
- Model safe behaviour when crossing the road
- Use the available supervised pedestrian crossing to cross Newling Street
- Where possible cross in an area away from parked cars
- Be conscious of road rules including abiding by 40KM Zones 8.00-9.30am and 2.30-4.00pm. Other rules include abiding by 'No Stopping Zones' and 'Bus Zones' and performing a u-turn across double lines or out the front of the school
- Parents are strongly advised to not call students across the road. Instead, the safest action is to meet your child at the school gates and walk with them or meet them at the crossing
- When parking be respectful of our local residents and ensure they have adequate space to access driveways
- If you are running late please ring the administration office prior to school finishing
- It is recommended to have a designated pick up point as children get confused if multiple exits are used

Students:

- Avoid walking through the car park as this is not a safe pedestrian area
- Should not be crossing the Pacific Highway without adult supervision
- Use the "Stop, Look, Listen, Think" strategy before crossing the road
- Use the available supervised pedestrian crossing to cross Newling Street
- Walk quickly and directly across the road
- Students should sensibly and promptly be sitting (weather permitting) at their designated bus / walkers line on the completion of school
- When walking home students are encouraged to walk along the council strip and not through local resident's front yards
- When using public transport, students should present their opal card, stay seated (where possible), place school bags under the seat and obey the driver
- Students return and wait with the supervising teacher if a parent, carer or designated person is not there to collect them
- At all times students of NPS should be respectful of our wider school community
- Students attending after school care should wait quietly on the silver seats located outside the hall
- Return the Riding Safely to School Declaration if riding a bike to and from school

Teachers

- Ensure all classes have reached their designated leaving point before exiting school grounds
- Ensure students are sitting (weather depending) and following school rules prior to leaving school grounds
- Closely monitor students leaving school grounds to ensure they are complying with road and transportation rules
- Wait until all students have been accounted for and collected by a parent, carer or designated person
- Students who have not been collected must be accompanied to the office where a staff member will
 make contact with parent, carer or where necessary emergency contact person. Staff will wait with the
 student until they are collected by an identified person

Uniform

I encourage all parents to ensure their child / children are in full school uniform, this includes black shoes with black shoe laces. Wearing full school uniform presents a strong message of unity and projects a positive image of school pride. If your child is unable to wear full school uniform on a particular day, please supply them with a note addressed to their teacher with an explanation. It is great to see so many students wearing their full school uniform each and every day.

Uniform Shop

The uniform shop is looking for a new coordinator / volunteers in 2023. Without assistance, the uniform shop will not be able to operate. If you can help at the shop, please make contact with the P&C on nararapublicschool@pandcaffiliate.org.au

Due to lack of volunteers the uniform shop at this point in time will not operate on Tuesday mornings as it has in the past. It will only be open Friday mornings 8:15am to 8:45am

Curriculum Reform

Students in Kindergarten to Year 2 will begin learning from a new English and Mathematics syllabus this year. One key change in the English syllabus is the way that teachers will support beginning readers. The following information has been adapted from the NSW Department of Education's curriculum support materials.

What is Phonic Knowledge?

Phonics is the understanding that there is a predictable relationship between phonemes (the sounds of spoken language) and graphemes (the letters that represent them in written language). At Narara Public School, we have explicitly taught phonics for a number of years, using the MSLE pedagogy. Decodable Texts

Decodable texts are specifically written for beginning readers as they are developing their blending and segmenting skills and their knowledge of phonics (the alphabetic code). The primary purpose of decodable texts is to provide students with the opportunity to practise what has been taught during explicit phonics instruction.

Decodable texts support students as they practise blending the letter-sounds they have been taught through words, in continuous meaningful text. In the context of effective reading instruction in the early years, decodable readers play an important role in supporting students to learn the alphabetic code.

This means that your K-2 child will not be sent home with a predictable text that older siblings may have previously used (repetitive text which encourages children to look at the picture, use their knowledge of high frequency words and other strategies to guess the text). Instead, they will be encouraged to practice decoding words, sentences and/ or passages that are decodable.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3 and 5. It is a nationwide measure to determine how young Australians are developing in literacy and numeracy.

This year, the NAPLAN Assessment will be held online. Students will need a pair of plug-in headphones and a plug-in mouse for both the NAPLAN practise test and the NAPLAN Assessment.

The assessment period is much earlier this year, beginning Wednesday 15th March (Week 8, Term 1). We will conduct practice tests across Week 6, from Tuesday 28th February – Thursday 2nd March.

Traffic and Parking around your School

Parking rules are designed to stop vehicles from parking where it would be dangerous or inconvenient for others. Please consider the residents when parking in streets surrounding your school.


- A School Zone is the area around a school with a speed limit of 40 km/h. Between the School Zone and End School Zone signs you must obey the school zone speed limit. The school zone speed limit only applies on gazetted school days and during the times shown on the sign.
- School Bus lights buses use signs and orange flashing 'wigwag' lights to warn motorists and pedestrians that they are picking up or setting down school children. The lights begin to flash when the bus stops and the doors are opened. They keep flashing for about 30 seconds after the doors close and continue even after the bus moves off. You must not drive past the bus in the same direction at more than 40 km/h while the 'wigwag' lights are flashing as there may be children crossing or about to cross the road.
- A No Parking Zone means that you must not stop for more than two minutes. You must remain in or within three metres of the vehicle. No Parking Zones are suitable for dropping off and picking up.



THESE SIGNS MEAN YOU MAY STOP HERE TO DROP OFF / PICK UP BUT YOU MUST

stop for up to 2 minutes only

stay within 3 metres of vehicle



A Bus Zone means that the area is restricted for bus use only. If hours of operation are shown, the restriction only applies to this time. You may use this area outside of these times.



A No Stopping Zone means no stopping at any time.








Other times when you must not stop

You must not stop your vehicle (that is, bring it to a stop and either stay with the vehicle or leave it parked) in the following circumstances:




Double parked (that is in the road alongside a car that is parked)

- Across a driveway or footpath
- On a median strip or traffic island
- On footpaths and nature strips
 - On or within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a children's crossing or pedestrian crossing




Within an intersection

Within 10 metres of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights unless signposted otherwise



In Bus Stop, Bus Zone, Taxi Stand or Taxi Zone signed areas

At least one metre from any other parked vehicle, close as possible and parallel to the kerb, and facing the same direction as the traffic lane



Within three metres of any double centre lines Within 20 metres before and 10 metres after a bus stop
