Traffic counts at various locations between Lisarow and West Gosford from Monday 11 November 2024

Transport for NSW acknowledges the Traditional Custodians of the lands on which we work and pays respect to Elders past and present.

The NSW Government is carrying out traffic survey investigations along Pacific Highway and Manns Road between Lisarow and West Gosford to inform future projects.

Transport for NSW have engaged contractors to carry out the work, which will provide Transport with a better understanding of current traffic, cyclist and pedestrian volumes and movements in the area.

What work are we doing?

Work will include installing tube traffic counters and cameras at multiple locations along and adjacent to the Pacific Highway and Manns Road corridor.

When and where we'll be working

From Monday 11 November from 7am to 6pm, Monday to Sunday, weather permitting.

Some night work will be required for tube count devices to be installed, monitored and removed.

Night work will be carried out **between 7pm and** 6am and is expected to be **completed in six** shifts over a three week period, weather permitting.

We will let you know in advance if we need to do any work outside these times. We have included a map to show the investigation area where the traffic counts will be carried out.

What will this mean for you?

The work will cause no disruption to your property.

You may notice workers in high vis clothing, using lighting to carry out the work.

Workers will park kerbside to install and remove traffic counting cameras on street poles and roadside furniture.

Tube counters will generate some noise - we are making every effort to minimise noise by completing the investigations in the shortest possible time frames.

Driveway access will be maintained at all times.

Traffic changes


There will be some temporary traffic changes to ensure the work zone is safe.

Single lane and shoulder closures with traffic control and a 40km/h speed limit may be in place while equipment is installed at night.

Please keep to speed limits and follow the direction of traffic controllers and signs.

Applying for my child to attend an opportunity class or selective high school

Why selective education?

Grouping high potential and gifted students together and using special teaching methods supports their:

- academic development
- emotional wellbeing
- friendships and social life.

Students tell us that they enjoy learning more when their classmates have similar abilities and interests.

Is it right for my child?

Here are some signs that your child may benefit from selective education.



Keep in mind, some children's high potential may be hidden. Being in an opportunity class or selective high school could help.

How can I support my child through the application process?



Talk to your child about the benefits and challenges of selective education and address their questions and concerns.



Apply for any required reasonable adjustments for disability or medical conditions.



Remind your child they only need to do a small amount of preparation for the placement test, and don't need coaching.



Ask your child's teacher (or other staff who know them well) whether they think selective education will suit your child.



Encourage your child to use the department's **free resources** to prepare for the test.

Support your child to continue co-curricular activities, see friends, eat healthily and sleep well in the lead-up to the test.

The Equity Placement Model reserves up to 20% of places in opportunity classes and selective high schools for high potential and gifted:

- students from low socio-educational advantage backgrounds
- Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students
- students from rural and remote locations
- students with disability
