#### School Development Days Term 4 & Term 1 2025

Schools are required to update their community of the School Development Days for the end of year and for the beginning of the 2025 school year. This information is as follows:

- Students last day for this year will be Wednesday 18 December. Staff will finish on Thursday 19
  December as they have completed twilight Professional Learning sessions to trade off the last day of
  the year (Friday 20 December).
- Next year, all students will be starting school on Thursday 6 February, following 4 school development days. These school development days provide teachers time to be best prepared individually and collectively to implement curriculum.

A full list of School Development Days for 2025 are as follows:

- 4 days at the start of Term 1 (31 Jan-5 Feb)
- 2 days at the start of Term 2 (28-29 April)
- 1 day at the start of Term 3 (21 July)
- 1 day at the start of Term 4 (13 October)

#### Step Up Day (Cancelled)

This year we are unable to accommodate Step Up Day as our mainstream student numbers are very close between 14 and 15 classes. At this point in time our anticipated student enrolments have our school at 15 mainstream classes for 2025, which is one more than this year. However, if our enrolments change before the end of term or at the beginning of next year through way of reduced student numbers it may mean we will be required to restructure to 14 mainstream classes. For this reason, we won't be offering Step Up Day. I believe it is very disruptive and counter productive to have Step Up Day when our student numbers are this tight as classes and their teachers could change into the new year. For the first week of 2025 (Thursday & Friday) we will have students in their 2024 classes with their current teacher where possible and in Week 2 we will form our 2025 classes. This model is very common with most public schools. We appreciate your understanding with this.

If you are moving out of the area or intend enrolling your child/ren at another school in 2025, please let the front office (43283024) know as soon as possible as we require accurate enrolment figures to determine how our classes are structured. If you are aware of any families moving into the area who will be enrolling at NPS in 2025 please ask them to make contact with the school as soon as possible.

#### **Student Academic Reports**

On Monday 16 December all students in K-6 will receive their Semester 2 report. Teachers spend many hours preparing your child's report and work hard to ensure that it is a true and accurate reflection of your child's progress in their learning over the semester. Please take the time to discuss the report with your child to reflect on their achievements and where there may need to be a greater focus for improvements to occur. I encourage all parents to read the front cover of the report as this gives an overview of the effort and achievement scale that is used.

Student attendance, both partial and whole day, are included. The attendance cut-off date for this semester was Friday 6 December.

#### **P&C / Uniform Shop**

A reminder the Uniform Shop will also be opening on Friday afternoons 2:00pm - 2:30pm in Week 9 to allow families more opportunity to access this service. Our amazing volunteers will also be extending the hours on Friday morning 8:30am - 12:00pm for Headstart (Kinder Transition) parents.

#### **School Swimming Carnival**

Due to the revised Water Safety for Unstructured Aquatic Activity Guidelines our School Swimming Carnival will be for competitors only (competent swimmers). The reason for this is that we are no longer able to offer the novelty component of the carnival as students are required to complete a proficiency test prior to an unstructured water activity to assess a student's aquatic skill level against a predetermined criterion. We simply do not have the time to undertake proficiency tests for all non-swimmers as it would mean we would be unable to complete the competitive component of the carnival.

Another contributing factor is that unstructured aquatic activities should also be conducted in a shallow body of water. The guidelines define a shallow body of water as water depth no higher than a student's waste. This would rule many students out of novelties all together which is not fair.

As a result, our 2025 carnival will be for competitors only (competent swimmers) and students not competing will remain at school with appropriate supervision engaging in alternate educational experiences. I believe it is unreasonable to ask families to pay for the bus and pool entry only to sit in a grandstand all day and not have the opportunity to enter the water. Thank you in advance for your understanding with this matter.



# Applying for my child to attend an opportunity class or selective high school

## Why selective education?

Grouping high potential and gifted students together and using special teaching methods supports their:

- · academic development
- · emotional wellbeing
- friendships and social life.

Students tell us that they enjoy learning more when their classmates have similar abilities and interests.

# Is it right for my child?

Here are some signs that your child may benefit from selective education.



learns quickly and easily



goaldriven



asks complex questions



good memory



curious and creative



deeply explores passions



Keep in mind, some children's high potential may be hidden. Being in an opportunity class or selective high school could help.

# How can I support my child through the application process?



Talk to your child about the benefits and challenges of selective education and address their questions and concerns.



Ask your child's teacher (or other staff who know them well) whether they think selective education will suit your child.



Apply for any required reasonable adjustments for disability or medical conditions.



Encourage your child to use the department's **free resources** to prepare for the test.



Remind your child they only need to do a small amount of preparation for the placement test, and don't need coaching.



Support your child to continue co-curricular activities, see friends, eat healthily and sleep well in the lead-up to the test.

The Equity Placement Model reserves up to 20% of places in opportunity classes and selective high schools for high potential and gifted:

- students from low socio-educational advantage backgrounds
- · Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander students
- · students from rural and remote locations
- · students with disability



# The School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using metro, train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

# Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

#### Years K-2 (Infants)

There is no minimum distance.

#### Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

#### Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.



If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.

## Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at

# How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

#### Step 1

Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at transportnsw.info/school-students

#### Step 2

The school endorses your application.

#### Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.



A parent or guardian must apply for students 15 years and under. Students 16 years and over can apply for themselves.



## **Better together**

The School Opal card is only for travel to and from school. So it's a good idea to get a Child/Youth Opal card for travel after hours, on weekends or during school holidays.

#### Child/Youth Opal card benefits

- · Concession fares across the Opal network
- Half-price travel after eight paid journeys each week\*
- \$1 transfer discount for every transfer between modes (metro/train, ferry, bus or light rail) as part of one journey within 60 minutes from the last tap off<sup>†</sup>
- Set auto top up and link it to your credit or debit card so there's always enough value on the card to travel.


